Our School Rules

1. We always try our best.
2. We are respectful of people and their property.

For younger children the principles of the rules are simplified to the following statement:

Kind hands, kind feet, kind words

BBC – Bum back of chair

TNT – Tummy near table, 6 feet firmly on the floor

Our Learning Behaviours

We have a star of the week in each class for our learning behaviours

1. Being a Clear Communicator
2. Being Resilient
3. Having a Positive Attitude
4. Being a Good Citizen
5. Being an Active Learner

Our Rewards for Good Behaviour

- **pupil reward points** – we are awarded reward points for good behaviour. These points are linked with following the school rules, good attendance and punctuality and displaying positive learning behaviours. Our points are recorded electronically and the points gained can be swapped for prizes.
- **celebration assembly**- selected work is celebrated in an assembly
- **WOWs**-we are given wow certificates for an instant reward.
- **other rewards** include positive verbal feedback, stickers, certificates and badges
- **leadership responsibility** – school council, prefects, sports captains, house captains
- **star of the week** – every class teacher nominates one pupil for star of the week and these are read out in our weekly celebration assembly and are published in the weekly newsletter.
- **class rewards**
- **sent to another teacher/Head of Academy to share our work**

Our Consequences

- If a child misbehaves, they are given a warning.
- If this continues, their name is recorded on C1. - A tick will then be placed next to their name.
- If behaviour continues, they receive another tick C2.
- If behaviours continues, they receive another tick C3. They are removed from the class for 5 minutes to think about their behaviour.
- If behaviour still doesn't improve, they go on a C4 and then lose their next play at lunch time and will be asked to reflect on their behaviour.
- If their behaviour carries on, they then go on onto a C5 where they are removed from class for the whole morning / afternoon.
- In extreme cases, children will move on to a C6 where they are excluded from school for a set period of time.

Monitoring and Review

This Behaviour Policy will be reviewed regularly by Serlby Park Primary School Council and updated when we make any changes to our behaviour system.
